About the Australasian CP Clinical Trials Network Centre for Research Excellence (AusCP-CTN CRE)

The AusCP-CTN CRE aims to advance earlier detection of CP, fast track children to multi-site clinical trials of new treatments, and develop and test interventions that will optimise outcomes for children with, or at high risk of CP (or similar conditions), and their families.
